

VISTA RV CROSSOVER

INDEPENDENT SUSPENSION AND A LONG LIST OF FEATURES SET THESE CAMPERS UP FOR ANY ADVENTURE

Vista RV Crossover is a company that does things a little differently. From day one, Vista RV Crossover set out to design camper trailers that can take massive amounts of punishment off-road yet still offer all the little comforts that you've probably become accustomed to back home. The designs feature a solid body and chassis and a complete lack of canvas to protect against water, mud and dust ingress.

On top of this, the company has developed the MS suspension system over thousands of hours of testing. Offering 330mm of travel and

robust construction that'll stand up to anything you throw at it, the MS system is a great asset to Vista RV Crossover and features on every one of their camper trailers.

We took a look at the flagship model, which shares the company's name, and the TVK, a smaller unit, to see what it's like to live the high life.



VISTA RV CROSSOVER

The Vista RV Crossover was the first brainchild of Louie Cretella. Along with his family and team of workers, he developed the Vista RV Crossover to offer enough off-road ability to take on any track in Australia, yet offer a few creature comforts that can have you organised for even the biggest of adventures.

"Men don't care about massive kitchens and luxury showers when they're in the bush, but they do normally want a few simple bits and pieces," Louie says. "We chose to include a kitchen to prepare food and a fridge to store the beer, but steered clear of any fancy trimmings that can add unnecessary weight and expense."

The Vista RV Crossover is made from fibreglass composite materials that are high-impact resistant. Coupled with a jig-assembled hot-dip galvanised chassis, the structural make up of the Vista RV Crossover is as bulletproof as they come.

So what's the difference between the original Vista RV Crossover and the TVK? "Essentially the TVK is the smaller brother to the Vista RV Crossover," Louie says. "It loses out on a few of the trimmings such as the stereo and internal kitchen, but this greatly reduces its weight and towing size."

"We've had a huge amount of interest in the TVK," Louie says. "Guys who are looking for something really mobile to tow on bigger trips with the boys, where you might not necessarily need all the bells and whistles that the missus demands, the TVK is ideal for that."

The TVK shares a lot of componentry with the Vista RV Crossover, so you know you're getting a tried and tested platform to base your adventures from. It's simply a few accessory variations and changes in the physical size of the TVK that have enabled it to fall into an extremely realistic price point for the average adventurer. The tare weight of the entire unit is a mere 1055kg, making it light enough to tow behind just about any 4WD.
